

Why should you guard your heart?

- 1. If you will not keep yourself, all the world will not be able to keep you.
- 2. If you will not keep yourself, the Devil will be your keeper. He is a jailor!
- 3. If you will not keep yourself, then you will never keep those who are committed to your keeping.

Application

- 1. Don't be slack. Be diligent to keep your heart.
- 2. Remember that you will have to give an account for yourself one day.
